





Third Grade Reading Proficiency










Children Who are Ready for Kindergarten

- ✓ The proportion of African Americans in Oakland is reflected in OUSD, however there is a higher proportion of Hispanics enrolled in OUSD compared to the city, 43% compared to 26%.
- ✓ Nearly 20 percent of center-based early care slots in Oakland are within the Oakland Unified School District. Another 8% are Head Start sites in the City of Oakland.
- ✓ Overall Quality Rating Improvement System average score as well as CLASS and ERS average scores show that OUSD sites are scoring at around 70 percent of the maximum possible rating.
- Compared to the state, there is a notably larger proportion of 3 and 4 year olds enrolled in preschool.
- ✓ Although over half of 3 and 4 year olds are enrolled in a preschool, only 40% are observed as ready for kindergarten in Oakland Unified School District.

Health Oakland



- 1. The Federal Poverty Level threshold for this figure was \$23,850 for a family of 4, http://aspe.hhs.gov.
- 2. Children 0-18 in low-income working families include the share of families that met three criteria: (1) the family income was less than twice the federal poverty level; (2) at least one parent worked 50 or more weeks during the previous year; (3) there was at least one "own child" under age 18 in the family.
- 3. All California Department of Education (CDE) Dataquest data presented are from 2014-15.
- 4. Kindergarten Special Education Enrollment include kindergarteners who have an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) and enrolled in a Special Education Program.
- 5. Designated English Language Learners who take the California English Language Development Test (CELDT) and have an overall score of Early Advanced or higher are considered proficient.
- 6. CDE defines truancy as absent from school without a valid excuse for 3 or more full days in 1 school year or tardy or absent for more than a 30 minute period during a school day without a valid excuse on 3 occasions in 1 year.
- 7. Quality Rating Improvement System (QRIS) completed scores for sites in OUSD participating in the QRIS as of 3/25/16.
- 8. Classroom Assessment Scoring System (CLASS) and Environment Rating System (ERS)
- 9. Preterm Birth=birth that occurred prior to 37 weeks gestation. Low birthweight = infants born at less than 5 lbs. 8 oz.
- 10. Births to mothers who reported receiving prenatal care only in the third trimester or reported receiving no prenatal care.
